BEN (New Star): You mean the little blue and green one? There between Mars and Venus?

STEVE-(Old Star): EXACTLY! And look! Right over there... That is the town of Nazareth!

BEN (New Star): Ohhh! Who's the pretty lady?

STEVE-(Old Star): That's Mary. She is a Virgin, and she is pledged to be married to a man named Joseph.

STEVE-(Old Star): Joseph is a carpenter. He is also a righteous man.

BEN (New Star): What's he doing?

STEVE-(Old Star): Building something. Carpenters are always building something.

BEN (New Star): I hope it's a cradle.

STEVE-(Old Star): I think you're getting ahead of our story.

BEN (New Star): Who's that other guy? He's all shiny – like us.

STEVE-(Old Star): That's Gabriel. He's an angel. He has come to talk to Mary. Let's listen.

JACOB (Gabriel): Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you.

JACOB (Gabriel): Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favor with God. You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High.

RYLEN (Mary): How will this be, since I am a virgin?

JACOB (Gabriel): The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So, the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God.

RYLEN (Mary): I am the Lord's servant. May it be to me as you have said.

BEN (New Star): What did all that mean?

STEVE-(Old Star): The angel told Mary that she is going to have a baby, who will be the Son of God.

BEN (New Star): And what did Mary say?

STEVE-(Old Star): She said "Yes."

BEN (New Star): Oh, good. Now what? I like Mary. She seems really nice.

STEVE-(Old Star): Oh, she is. After the angel left her, Mary hurried to visit her cousin, Elizabeth.

RYLEN (Mary): Elizabeth!

MADDIE (Elizabeth): Mary!

STEVE-(Old Star): When Mary arrived, she found out that things were just like the angel had told her.

BEN (New Star): Mary seems really happy to see Elizabeth! And just think, Elizabeth was going to have a baby in her old age. It was a miracle!

STEVE-(Old Star): Yes! And Mary wasn't the only one who was happy. Elizabeth was happy too! Listen to what she said to Mary!

MADDIE (Elizabeth): Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?

RYLEN (Mary): My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me—holy is his name.

STEVE-(Old Star): Mary stayed with Elizabeth for a long visit and then returned home to Nazareth. But by now it was more obvious that she was going to have a baby.

BEN (New Star): Uh, oh. What did Joseph say?

STEVE-(Old Star): Well, Joseph knew the baby wasn't his. But, since Joseph was a righteous man, he decided to put Mary away privately.

STEVE-(Old Star): But after he had considered these things, God sent an angel to speak to him in a dream.

JACOB (Gabriel): Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.

BEN (New Star): Sort of like a family reunion?

STEVE-(Old Star): A little bit... but without the games or the potato salad.

BEN (New Star): That's too bad. I love potato salad. Did they have cookies? I love cookies too!

STEVE-(Old Star): I don't think so.

BEN (New Star): Then it really wasn't much like a family reunion at all.

STEVE-(Old Star): No. In fact, for Mary and Joseph, it was a pretty long and difficult trip; especially since Mary was expecting a baby.

BEN (New Star): Where did they have to go? They went to a little town called ...Bethlehem.

BEN (New Star): Do you mean that little, bitty town over there in the middle of nowhere?

STEVE-(Old Star): That's the one! It was the birthplace of Joseph's ancestor, King David.

BEN (New Star): Wait a minute! Bethlehem... Isn't that the one they sing about? The one they call "O, little town" of Bethlehem?

STEVE-(Old Star): Yes!

BEN (New Star): I really like that song. They even sing about how "the silent stars go by..."

STEVE-(Old Star): Listen, I think someone's going to sing it now.

BEN (New Star): Wow. They can really sing! But listen, I thought this was a story about the First Christmas. When do we get to the part with the tree and the star?

STEVE-(Old Star): There was no tree on the first Christmas, but there was a star.

BEN (New Star): Where?

STEVE-(Old Star): We're getting there. First we have to hear more about Mary and Joseph.

BEN (New Star): Okay.

STEVE-(Old Star): So, Joseph went to Bethlehem to be counted, and Mary went with him.

BEN (New Star): Look! Mary and Joseph have arrived in Bethlehem. I hope they have somewhere nice to stay. Mary looks very tired.

STEVE-(Old Star): You're right. But there was no room for them in the inn. So, Mary and Joseph stayed in a stable.

BEN (New Star): A stable!? Do you mean like for cows, and horses, and goats, and sheep, and...?

STEVE-(Old Star): Yep. Mary and Joseph stayed in a humble stable. There Mary had her baby, and she wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in the manger.

BEN (New Star): Why did they put the baby in a manger?

STEVE-(Old Star): It was probably the safest and best place they had for Him. I'm sure that Joseph lined it with fresh, new hay and stood watch over Mary and the baby during the night.

BEN (New Star): What did they name the baby?

STEVE-(Old Star): They named Him, Jesus, which means "The LORD saves." And now for the first time up in the sky there was a New Star; announcing the birth of the Messiah.

BEN (New Star): Look! I think they're going to sing again!

STEVE-(Old Star): They do that a lot at Christmas time...

BEN (New Star): Wow! That was a really great song! Just think. A new star in the sky! How wonderful! How glorious! No one on earth could have missed that!

STEVE-(Old Star): It's amazing that not only did people miss the Messiah then, but that they still miss Him today. Maybe it's because they aren't really looking for the Messiah.

But God didn't rely on a single new star to announce the birth of His Son. He also sent an angel to tell a group of shepherds all about it.

Of course, it really frightened the shepherds to suddenly see an angel.

JACOB (Gabriel): Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. To-day in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.

STEVE-(Old Star): Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying...

JALIYAH, BRIAH, SUNNY, AMELIA, MADDIE – (Angels): Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests.

STEVE-(Old Star): When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another...

CONLEY –(Shepherd): Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about.

STEVE-(Old Star): So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger.

STEVE-(Old Star): When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

BEN (New Star): So, that's the story of the First Christmas and the Star.

STEVE-(Old Star): Yes, but there is more to the story. Look – over there in the east.

BEN (New Star): Who are those guys?

STEVE-(Old Star): They are three wise men. But they can tell us themselves.

MADDIE (King #1): We three kings of Orient are.

AMELIA (King #2): Bearing gifts we traverse afar.

SUNNY (King #3): Field and fountain, moor and mountain, Following yonder star.

BEN (New Star): Wait a minute! Wait a minute! What are they saying?

STEVE-(Old Star): It's from an old song; about the three wise men. They are saying that they are three kings from the east; and that they've traveled a long way to get here.

BEN (New Star): Oh, I get it! And they saw New Star! And they followed it... because they were wise enough to know that it meant the Savior had been born.

STEVE-(Old Star): That's right! Listen... It looks like something is going on over there. I believe those little kids might sing a song.

LITTLE KIDS SING: "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star"
"Away in a Manger"

BEN (New Star): Oh, I like the kings. And look! They brought presents! Who are they for?

STEVE-(Old Star): The gifts are for the Baby Jesus. They are Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh. Gold because Jesus is the King. Frankincense because He is the High Priest. And Myrrh because of His Sacrifice.

BEN (New Star): Hey! Where are they going? Bethlehem's over there! Hey, Fellas! You're going the wrong way! The baby's over there!

STEVE-(Old Star): They are going to Jerusalem, to the palace, to look for the King of the Jews.

BEN (New Star): But why? The baby is in Bethlehem. Over there! He was born in a stable!

STEVE-(Old Star): They went looking for the baby king in a palace. But they didn't find Him there.

BEN (New Star): Who did they find?

STEVE-(Old Star): Well, unfortunately, they met an evil man named Herod, who was the local ruler.

MADDIE (King #1): Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews?

AMELIA (King #2): We saw his star in the east.

SUNNY (King #3): And we have come to worship Him.

STEVE-(Old Star): When Herod heard all of this he was greatly distressed and all of Jerusalem with him. He called in the Jewish chief priests and the teachers of the law and asked them where the Messiah was to be born.

CONLEY (Scribe): In Bethlehem in Judea. For this is what the prophet has written...

(as if reading from a scroll) "But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the shepherd of my people Israel."

GARRIN (Herod): Go to Bethlehem and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find Him, come and tell me, so that I may come and worship Him too.

STEVE-(Old Star): So the Wise Men went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him.

STEVE-(Old Star): Then they gave him their gifts and went back to their own countries. But having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they went home a different way.

BEN (New Star): Why didn't they go back to see Herod?

STEVE-(Old Star): Because Herod didn't really want to worship Jesus. He wanted to destroy him!

BEN (New Star): That's horrible!

STEVE-(Old Star): Yes, it was.

BEN (New Star): What happened to Baby Jesus?

STEVE-(Old Star): An angel was sent to warn Joseph in a dream to take his family away to Egypt, where they would be safe. They escaped into the night before Herod found them.

BEN (New Star): That's wonderful! Is that the whole story?

STEVE-(Old Star): There is a little more... When it was safe to return, the child Jesus and His Family traveled back to Nazareth where he was raised. Jesus was the Son of God and He did all of the things that were prophesied about Him. He lived a perfect life and died on a cross for all sin, and rose again to live forever. Now He sits at the right hand of God the Father, and one day He will come to judge the world.

BEN (New Star): That's amazing! And how do you know all of this?

STEVE-(Old Star): Oh, I saw it all, from up here in the sky; for you see, I am the New Star that appeared that night.

BEN (New Star): Really!? You are the New Star? But you are so old.

STEVE-(Old Star): So is the story, over 2000 years old... But it is still as true today as it was on that very First Christmas. And that's why we still celebrate Christmas today.

BEN (New Star): That's amazing! Thank you for telling me the story. I think I will shine a little brighter now that I know all of this.

STEVE-(Old Star): Well, you know what King David said:

The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they display knowledge. There is no speech or language where their voice is not heard. Their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world.

BEN (New Star): Yeah! Well said!! Hey, is that the same King David?

STEVE-(Old Star): Yes. King David, the ancestor of Joseph, the one who was born in Bethlehem, all those years ago.

BEN (New Star): Wow, I like that guy. He has a real way with words.

BEN (New Star): Okay... So... What now?

STEVE-(Old Star): Looks like it's time for another song.

BEN (New Star): And cookies? I love cookies.

STEVE-(Old Star): Yes, yes... We'll get you some cookies. Come on!
